



#### 1 Peter 2:2-10


Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. 
We will mark Ascension Day on Thursday, May 21 with a worship service via Zoom. You are invited to video or call in to the service, which begins at 7:00 pm.



# **Prayers for Communion in Spirit**

May God our Creator renew in you the creative Spirit that brings healing and life to our world. **Amen.** 


May Jesus the Christ, uphold you in grace and love. Amen.
