
How wonderful are you O God, in all of your holy places, giving strength and power to your people! Blessed be God!

People: And also with you.





May God our Creator renew in you the creative Spirit that brings healing and life to our world. **Amen.**


May Jesus the Christ, uphold you in grace and love. Amen.
