



I give thanks to you O God with my whole heart.


Matthew 10:24-39

Prayers for Communion in Spirit

Celebrant: Though we are separated from one another spatially, we remain connected to each other in heart and spirit as we contemplate the real presence of Christ in our midst. Prayer of Thanksgiving


